

### Severe Weather Awareness Week

### April 8 - 12

One of the greatest threats we face here at Congregational Home is severe weather. This can range from thunderstorms and high winds to hail and tornados. We have procedures in place to ensure that residents are notified when severe weather is approaching, and it is everyone's job to be diligent when there is a threat of severe weather.

As part of Severe Weather Awareness Week, Congregational Home will conduct a severe weather drill on April 11 in conjunction with the statewide severe weather drills.

Weather radios are monitored at the Fireside East Nurse's Station, in the Reception Office, and in the Maintenance Shop to ensure that whenever the National Weather Service issues either a Tornado Watch or a Tornado Warning, we receive notification.

Upon notification of a watch or a warning, an overhead announcement will be made.

"Code Yellow - Tornado Watch" will be repeated three times. Staff and residents should enter a Tornado Watch mindful that a tornado might strike within the next few hours, or even minutes. They should close blinds, drapes, and other window coverings to prevent glass from flying. They should be prepared to take cover in an interior room or corridor, in a lower level, or in the basement. And they should monitor radio and television stations for more information. While the watch may expire without a real threat, at least we will be ready.

"Code Yellow - Tornado Warning" will be repeated three times. Staff and residents should enter a Tornado Warning mindful that a tornado has been sighted in the area, or has been seen on radar, and that there is an imminent threat of a tornado. They should take should take cover in an interior room or corridor, in a lower level, or in the basement. If they are in a corridor, they should close fire doors as they move through it in order to create a more isolated safe area. And they should monitor radio and television stations for more information. While a tornado may not strike, at least we will be ready.

Being aware of impending severe weather and knowing what to do during these incidents can make all the difference in the world in how we fare, should we be directly impacted by severe weather.
