

As old man winter prepares to bring us cold weather, ice, and snow, we want everyone to be prepared for the conditions that winter brings us every year.

Preparing for winter weather should begin before ice and snow are even on the ground. Having an emergency supply kit in both your home and your vehicle could save your or a neighbor's life during a winter storm. An emergency kit should include items such as food, water, a flashlight and batteries, and blankets. Also, be sure to keep a snow shovel, extra gloves and hats, and kitty litter or sand in your vehicle. The kitty litter or sand will help give your tires traction if you get stuck on an icy road.

When out waking, always watch for snow and ice on sidewalks and parking lots, and wear footwear appropriate for the conditions.

According to the National Weather Service, Wisconsin experiences a handful of winter storms every year. And according to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, many people are killed and many more are injured in crashes on icy/snowy roads every year. Driving in winter can be extremely hazardous.

Before you head out, you can check the 511 Wisconsin system for the latest road and traffic conditions, and live traffic cameras. You can access the system on the free mobile app, on the website - www.511wi.gov., or on Twitter - @511Wl. If there's a severe snowstorm, and you don't have to drive, stay home. If you have to drive, be sure you have an emergency supply kit in your vehicle, leave early, and let people know where you are going and when you expect to get there.

Before you head out, you can also check ReadyWisconsin.wi.gov for winter weather maps, tips on winter driving, and tips on putting together emergency kits.
